
Revisiting some key slides from PSU Administration's February 26 Budget Forum.

Moreover, additional regional data on enrollment projections from a book recommended by Susan Jeffords shows even BETTER news for Portland.




Figure 6.3 Forecasted growth in students who will attend a regional four-year institution, 2012 to 2029
